I am a practicing anesthesiologist at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard Medical School who has conducted research in anesthetic mechanisms for nearly two decades. I currently direct an NIH-funded translational research program that investigates how neural circuits involved in sleep and arousal mediate anesthetic-induced unconsciousness and emergence from general anesthesia. Because my research interests are highly pertinent to perioperative neuroscience, I have been an active participant at SNACC Annual Meetings since 2014 as an invited speaker, panel moderator, and poster session moderator. I also helped to organize the 2018 SNACC Neuroscience Symposium entitled "Effects of Anesthetics on the Brain." In addition, I have been a member of the ASA Subcommittee on Experimental Neurosciences for the past 10 years, and served as chair from 2012-2016.
