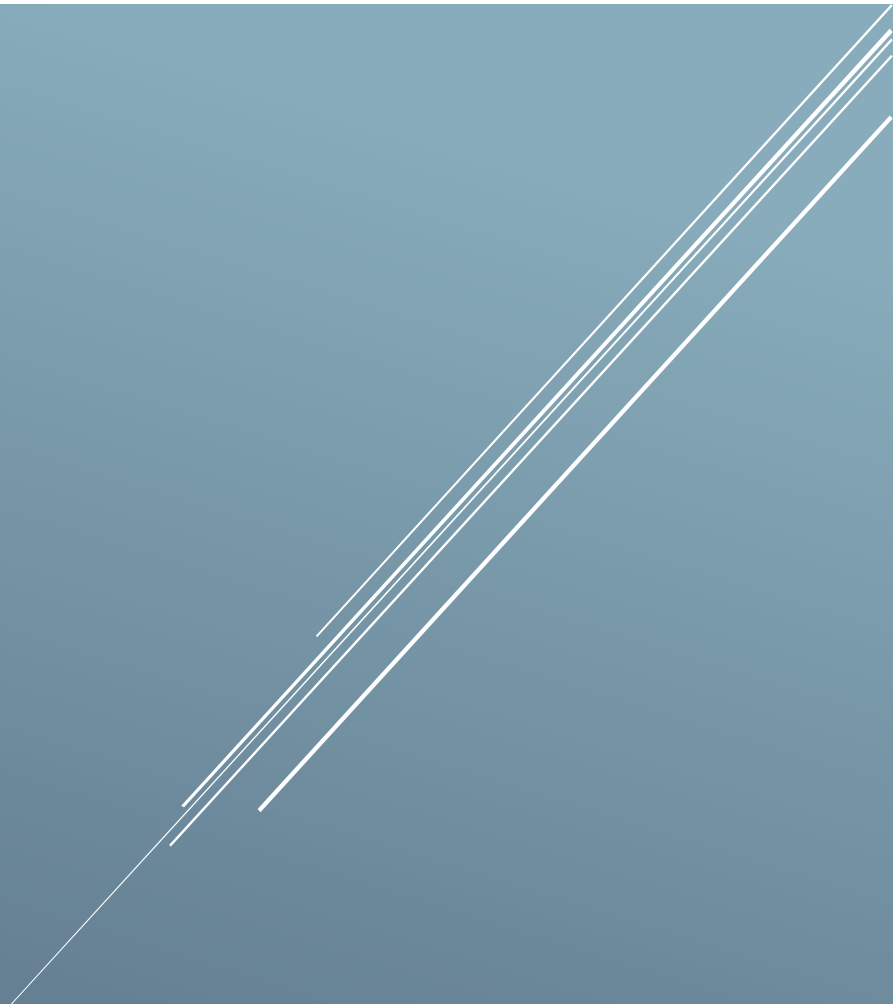
**How do you envision advancing SNACC as a Director-at-Large? (limit 150 words)**

I also supervise anaesthetic doctors in training and support their educational needs through formal didactic lectures, simulation training and being an educational supervisor.

### **Neuroanaesthesia**

#### *Direct Clinical Care*

I completed a clinical fellowship (OOPE year) in neuroanaesthesia and neuro-critical care to consolidate my clinical experience, knowledge and management of neurology and neurosurgical patients. My clinical duties involved distant supervised lists doing craniotomies, ventriculoperitoneal shunts, complex spinal and interventional neuroradiology procedures. I became proficient in managing this variety of patients' peri-operatively. During this fellowship year, I managed complex airway cases. For example cases requiring awake tracheostomy under local anaesthetic and awake/asleep fibre optic intubation due to high cervical/ cerebello-pontine angle tumour or abscesses.

#### *On Call*

My on-call duties involved managing emergency theatre cases, reviewing critically unwell patients on the wards and managing the transfer of intubated patients for emergency CT/MRI scans. During my night time on calls, I supervised junior colleagues managing the surgical neuro-critical care unit and led the night ward round on the medical and surgical neuro-critical care unit.

#### *Complex Airway*

During this fellowship year, I got to do some complex airway cases that required an awake tracheostomy or fibre optic intubation due to high cervical/CPA tumour or abscesses.
